Markus Boos, MD, PhD, is an attending pediatric dermatologist at Seattle Children's Hospital and is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Washington School of Medicine. Dr. Boos was raised in the suburbs of Detroit and received a BA in Biology and Economics from Kalamazoo College in Kalamazoo, MI. He subsequently joined the Medical Scientist Training Program at the University of Chicago, where he obtained his MD and a PhD degree in Immunology. He completed an internship in Pediatrics at the University of Chicago's Comer Children's Hospital before joining the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania as a Dermatology resident. There he served as chief resident before completing a fellowship in Pediatric Dermatology at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. Dr. Boos enjoys caring for all children with skin disorders but has a special interest in primary cutaneous lymphoma, the skin manifestations of immunodeficiency and LGBTQ health. He is an advocate for climate/environmental health as it relates to children's health. He also loves Montana and his boyfriend was a former student body president at the University of Montana.

Sophie Lanciers, MD, FAAP - Dr. Lanciers, a native of Belgium, earned her M.D. degree cum laude from the Free University of Brussels, Belgium. She trained in Anesthesiology, Pediatrics, Pediatric Gastroenterology, and Obesity Medicine. She recently joined St. Vincent's Hospital (Billings) from New Orleans, where she was an assistant professor of Pediatrics at Tulane University and an Attending Pediatric Gastroenterologist at Tulane Medical Center. She has a special interest in the treatment and prevention of childhood obesity. She is certified by the American Board of Pediatrics and the American Board of Obesity Medicine. Dr. Lanciers speaks Spanish, Dutch, French and German.
